1번 대화를 듣고, 여자가 구입할 화분을 고르시오.

- M: Hi. How can I help you?
- W: I'm looking for a flowerpot that I can use for my creeping plant.
- M: If you're looking for a pot with a hanger, we have several you can choose from.
- W: Actually, I need a pot I can put on the windowsill, not one with a hanger.
- M: I see. Then how about this square-shaped one?
